Objectives:


Students will practice drawing in one and two-point perspective in order to create a drawing of a city that is designed from imagination or combines elements of existing cities and architectural styles.





Students will create pages from the book using cardboard pieces and a variety of techniques


Ages: K-5th special education

Students will understand perspective and how elements of art influence our perspective when looking at works of art.


Students will understand that the 5 senses influence our perspective when looking at art.
